

Penny Challenge for National Lutheran Schools Week

A Penny Challenge is a fun way to raise money for a special cause. This year's designation is Lutheran Family Services of Nebraska (January's Mission of the Month).

How the Penny Challenge works.

- Each classroom will provide a container to collect pennies.
- Pennies should be added to the containers each morning between 8:30-8:45. The classroom teacher is responsible to secure your container each night safe keeping. Extra containers may be used if necessary.
- The goal is for classrooms to raise as much money as possible in penny form. Penny rolls are allowed.
- HOWEVER, other classrooms can "sabotage" how much money you have raised by placing silver coins (nickels, dimes, quarters) into other classroom containers. Dropping in "rolls" of silver coins is not permitted.
 - For example, on Monday, Mrs. Douglass' room raises 240 cents in pennies. However, Mr. Majorins' class drops in 2 quarters, 4 dimes, and 2 nickels. This would bring the "total" for the class down to 140 cents raised.
- Classrooms want to encourage one another to gather together as many pennies as they can so they don't end up with a negative amount throughout the week.
- The classroom with the highest positive penny amount will win a prize.
